No Ways Tired

Galatians 6:9

On September 15, 1963, the world changed for most churchgoing black children. Four little girls went to the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama with their families, like all of us have a million times—only they didn't return home.

In what is now called a post-racial, trans racial, multiracial America of 2019, going to church and not returning home seems absurd. Things like that could only happen against the backdrop of old school hate.

Guess what? It feels like the 1960's all over again.

Has the external world not changed? Black men are still being beaten and murdered. People are still marching in the streets. According to some elected officials, "the negro problem" still exists. It's just discussed discretely using fancier synonyms. And, new heroes are still emerging in the struggle.

So what are we to do? It is important to remember that the real difference comes from within our ranks. Everyone is a teacher and we must use everything as a teachable moment. That is what happened during the hate-filled racism of the 60's. Black families protected their children with a wall of history, knowledge and context. They talked and educated each other—not just book learning but world learning was an armor of protection, along with faith and a sense of community.

It is unthinkable that in 2019, as Black America has accomplished so much, we are yet having the "color of our skin" conversation. We must continue to use our words to protect ourselves and humanize the black experience for others. And when we tire, let us become reinvigorated, committed and recommitted to the notion of leaning on Christ and feeling no ways tired.

Throughout the history of heartache and pain wrought upon us as a people, we've maintained this spirit. And with the trials and tribulations of life, we still declare that we are "no ways tired."

One might say that "no ways tired" is a Sankofa declaration. Sankofa stems from the Twi language of Ghana and is translated, "It is not taboo to fetch what is at risk of being left behind." As we move forward by faith, we do so with the Spirit of Christ and a Sankofa state of mind. We're blessed with a legacy of those who faced oppression, discrimination and unjust treatment with dignity

and determination. African Americans have endured such injustice and yet have summoned the most creative force and spiritual fortitude to get us through the searing eras of slavery, Jim Crow and the Civil Rights Movement. So we don't hesitate to reach back with our feet firmly planted in place for the forward call.

We don't minimize the level of burdens that anyone faces. Societal inequalities alone can cause stress and illness upon our community that is not shared by others. At the same time, we reach back with the affirmation that we are no ways tired as we press toward the mark. We don't make this declaration simply because the year is still quite new. We're no ways tired because we serve a God who makes all things new!

I pray that you have a "no ways tired" state of mind and faith in our God that shows forth His goodness and light in the world. Beloved, let's not slow up or give in to slack. Let us all, together, march on til' victory is won!


